Dear Families,

Week 5 has been a challenging one. We have had 9 staff members who have been away due to COVID or being a COVID close contact. All staff are staying home if they have any symptoms to ensure our students and families stay safe. We have not been able to cover all classes with relief staff.

All of our specialist teachers have taken classes and students have stayed in their class for specialist subjects. This has meant that teachers have had to cover more yard duties and not have any time to meet, plan and analyse student data.

Our SSOs have also taken on more yard duties and have been moved around the school to support where it is required.

Staff are in constant contact with me and they all miss us and can't wait to be back.






Breakfast Club

If you want to know more about Breakfast Club, or if you are able to donate any items such as jam, margarine or vegemite please let me know.


