Principal's Message

Term 2 has started well for both students and educators.

We started with teachers and SSOs learning together during our Pupil Free Day. Our teachers spent the day focusing on writing assessments. When teachers plan writing lessons they know exactly what each child can do and what their next steps are. This can be a complex task when there are so many different ability levels in one class.

Our teachers analyse student writing samples and constantly assess students throughout the day. Our highly skilled teachers design learning that not only supports and extends learning but fosters a love of writing and reading. I encourage you to talk to your child about what they are writing during book making or writers notebook.

SSOs spent the day looking at Zones of Proximal Development (ZPD) and scaffolding learning. SSOs spent a lot of time supporting students to move to that next step in their learning. This could be in the areas of literacy, numeracy or social development. Getting the scaffolding right is a challenging task and our SSOs work tirelessly to get this right. We don't want learning to be too easy and we don't want it to be so hard that the student lacks confidence. SSOs know exactly where the student is on their learning journey. They are supported to be confident and to take risks ensuring all students demonstrate growth in their learning.

It was a challenging day and one we all enjoyed.

Our students are all settled in their classrooms. We have had several new students join us this term and they have been welcomed and looked after by their classmates and teachers.

Some of our students have been training for SAPSASA Cross Country and a group of student leaders have presented at a Lumination Launch with Sarah K and Chanelle. They talked about our STEM program at Northfield in front of our Minister for Education, Blair Boyle. They said they were nervous but presented well.

Attendance Matters

Every child and young person has a right to an education that develops their talent and ability to reach their fullest potential. Attendance at school, especially primary school, gives children opportunities to develop the basic building blocks for learning and educational attainment, as well as social and emotional skills such as good communication, resilience and teamwork.



At Northfield, we create a welcoming environment for all students to attend school and participate in learning. Positive relationships with students, staff and the school community support our sense of belonging and engagement with learning and school activities.

ABSENT FROM SCHOOL

Text messages are sent out daily notifying parents and guardians of any absences. In the event of an absence, please call the school on 8262 2607, email dl.0314.info@schools.sa.edu.au with an explanation from a parent or guardian, message the class teacher on SeeSaw or message the school through the School Stream app.

Medical certificates are required if the student has 3 or more days absence. Exemptions from school can be arranged if an extended period of absence is required for medical or personal reasons


