There are many reasons we have composite classes. We would like to re-assure families that all students are stretched and supported in all areas of their learning. Teachers focus on skill building for every student.

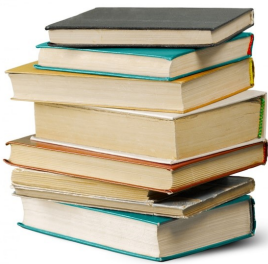
Teacher placement is also a complex task and we don't always complete these placements until the last minute. All teachers at Northfield are highly skilled and dedicated to all students.
